2-1-1 is more than just Information and Referral!

Crisis Hotline—Trained staff provide problem solving and options to assist callers in crisis in a nonjudgmental way. The crisis hotline is available 24/7.

Information and Referral—Trained staff provide 24/7 information and referral on over 2,000 programs serving the residents of Licking, Knox, Muskingum, Morgan and Perry Counties.

Online Resource Directory—Search for your own resources at ww.211pathways.com and click the Online Resource Directory button. An AIRS Certified Resource Specialist updates the resource database on a bi-weekly basis.

Recovery Line—For those recovering from a variety of mental health issues who would like support in following their recovery plans.

Disaster Services—In partnership with 9-1-1 and local EMA's, residents are encouraged to call 2-1-1 for non-emergency crisis management, general information, and access to community resources during times of disaster and emergencies allowing 9-1-1 to focus on emergency calls.

Suicide Prevention Follow-Up Services—For callers that have attempted or threatened suicide that would like support in their recovery. Staff call at pre-arranged times as agreed with the caller.

Operation Feed of Licking County is a community-wide food drive which coordinates and promotes the collection of food from employees and Licking County residents to feed those in need during times of emergency. The food is stocked at the Food Pantry Network of Licking County and distributed to member pantries and social service organizations that supply emergency



meals for people who are hungry. According to the Food Pantry Network's website, member agencies of the Food Pantry Network of Licking County served 1,435,743 meals to 331,996 individuals in 2015. Approximately 35% of the recipients were children and infants.

This year, Pathways is participating in Operation Feed by not only conducting a food drive internally, but by also serving as a drop off point for the community. Anyone wishing to make a donation can drop off their items at our administrative offices located at 1627 Bryn Mawr Dr in Newark. Boxes are set up in the lobby area for food donations. Anyone wishing to made a monetary donation may make their check payable to The Food Pantry Network, and can leave it with a staff member. Operation Feed ends on March 20, 2016. If you or anyone you know is struggling with hunger, please give us a call at 2-1-1, 345-HELP, or the Food Pantry Network at 740-344-7401.
