2-1-1 March Community Report



The Family and Children First Council was formed in response to state legislation mandating all 88 counties in Ohio to form a local council, with the purpose of coordinating and streamlining existing publicly funded services which serve children and families. The Council is an association of public and non-profit organizations, schools, clergy, parents and elected officials committed to improving the local social and human service

delivery system. The council provides funding to a variety of services committed to improving the well-being of children and families.

Local councils can assist in developing a collaborative plan of action for multi-need children and adolescents upon referral. A child may be considered a multi-need child if he/she is involved or eligible for involvement with more than one FCF involved agency (BDD, Juvenile Court, mental health or substance abuse services, among others.) Secondary services such as peer support partners, respite care, intensive home based services, in home support services may be available to children that are active in the FCF Wraparound program.







SEARCH Guide:

* Add the location where you are looking

for services. You can add the city and/or zip. By adding a zip code your results will sort by proximity to that zip code.

* Look for an **Agency** OR a **Specific type** of Service.

If you are looking for a specific
Agency be sure to use the proper name.
If you do not know the full name use the keyword field to search.

- Use the **Service Category** field to search for a service. Begin typing and we will suggest categories that are in our database.

* To narrow your results even further, use the **Area Served** field to only return results that are available in the area you are looking for help. You can enter a city or specific zip code.
