MHA Suicide Prevention Program

Mental Health America of Licking County's Suicide Prevention Coordinator, Christina Pena, visits most Licking County middle and high schools each school year, sharing a curriculum called Signs of Suicide coupled with depression screening with over 3000 students annually. Johnstown High School



Student Support Specialist Shannon Cox has shared that the impact has been far-

reaching, giving students the information they need to understand what they have experienced themselves or seen in others around them. For adults, we provide full day Mental Health First Aid trainings to help them understand what to do when presented with someone exhibiting signs and symptoms of a mental health disorder or crisis. Two-hour Question Persuade Refer (QPR) Gatekeeper suicide prevention trainings are also offered to teach about the signs of mental illness and suicide. Both trainings describe the signs and symptoms that are often associated with depression and other mental health disorders, the risk factors that increase the likelihood that a mental illness may develop, and the protective factors that help to insulate us from those risk factors.

Christina facilitates a weekly support group at MHA's office for people who have depression or bipolar disorder. She also moderates a monthly support group for people who have lost someone to suicide. Having the opportunity to share such an experience with others who have gone through something similar can be a powerful step toward healing.

OTHER SUICIDE PREVENTION ACTIVITIES:


- Licking County L.O.S.S. Team the team visits scenes of suicide to offer support and resources to families and loved ones
- Walk and candlelight vigil during Suicide Prevention Awareness month in September
- Licking County Suicide Prevention Coalition meets monthly to review suicide statistics in our county and plan for the promotion of suicide prevention awareness
- Lou Mitchell Memorial Golf Tournament to benefit the Suicide Prevention program

Search using Agency/Program Name when you know one of the words in a service provider name or program name. For example, search with the words red and cross to find American Red Cross locations and see what services are offered.

Guided Search

Search using Guided Search when you are uncertain of the service term. Services are grouped by categories to assist you in finding the particular service need. Click the ? to see a definition of the service terms you find.
