

Every hour of every day, someone in our region needs essential services, regardless of their income. Whether you need help during disasters like a derecho, ice storm, even a pandemic, or in everyday situations such as finding free tax preparation sites, 2-1-1

powered by Pathways of Central Ohio helps you find important health and human services in your local community.

By dialing a free, easy-to-remember phone number, or texting your zip code to 2-1-1, callers reach trained specialists who identify their needs and offer them information on thousands of programs and services that specialize in meeting critical basic needs such as food and housing; physical and mental health resources; employment supports; assistance for older adults and people with disabilities; and support for children, youth and families.



As we celebrate National 2-1-1 Awareness

Day, on February 11, the 2-1-1/Crisis Hotline of Pathways of Central Ohio would like to say thank you for joining our 2-1-1 network to help support many individuals, families, and communities. With your support, thousands of people throughout our region are connected to the resources they need every day and in crisis situations.

- \* Pathways 2-1-1/Crisis Hotline received 23,073 calls in 2021 from people who needed help.
- \* Pathways 2-1-1/Crisis Hotline received over 750 calls from people requesting help due to COVID-19.
- \* Pathways 2-1-1/Crisis Hotline provides a vital link between service providers and those who most need assistance.
- \* Anyone who needs help in Athens, Crawford, Guernsey, Knox, Licking, Marion, Monroe, Morgan, Muskingum, Noble, Perry, Pickaway, Washington and Wyandot counties can reach Pathways 2-1-1/Crisis Hotline simply by dialing 2-1-1 on their telephone, or by texting their zip code to 898-211. Marion County residents can reach us by calling 740-383-2273.
- \* Anyone who calls the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline number (1-800-273-TALK) in the counties we serve will reach Pathways 2-1-1/Crisis Hotline's highly trained counselors.
- \* Pathways 2-1-1/Crisis Hotline's services are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.
- \* Pathways 2-1-1/Crisis Hotline maintains an extensive service directory of 1,095 agencies and detailed listings of more than 6,500 services and programs to which callers can be referred. This information is available to the public either by calling 2-1-1 or on the Pathways 2-1-1/Crisis Hotline website at 211 pathways.com.
- \* Over half of the callers contacting Pathways 2-1-1/Crisis Hotline were looking for access to basic needs including food assistance, medical care, housing, utility assistance or rent assistance.

Search using Agency/Program Name when you know one of the words in a service provider name or program name. For example, search with the words red and cross to find American Red Cross locations and see what services are offered.

#### **Guided Search**

Search using Guided Search when you are uncertain of the service term. Services are grouped by categories to assist you in finding the particular service need. Click the ? to see a definition of the service terms you find.
