Get Ready to Vote!

The General Election is Tuesday, November 8, 2022. Some other notable dates are:

<u>Registration Deadlines (including change of address)</u>

By Mail (Postmarked by), In-person at election office or Online (olvr.ohiosos.gov) - October 11, 2022

Absentee Ballot Deadlines

Request Ballot - (received by) November 5, 2022

Return ballot by mail - (Postmarked by) November 7, 2022

Return ballot in person - November 8, 2022

Voting Deadlines

Early Voting - October 12-November 7, 2022

In-person - November 8, 2022

You will need to show ID to vote in Ohio. Acceptable forms include:

 \cdot unexpired Ohio driver's license or state ID card

· military ID

• photo ID issued by the US government or the State of Ohio that contains your name and current address and that has an expiration date that has not passed

· current (within the last 12 months) utility bill, bank statement,



government check, paycheck, or other government document (other than a notice of voter registration mailed by a board of elections) that shows your name and current address

An unexpired Ohio Driver License, State ID Card, or Interim Documentation with your former address IS an ACCEPTABLE form of ID when your current address is in the pollbook.

Voters without ID: If you do not have any of the above forms of identification you may provide either your Ohio driver's license or state identification number (which begins with two letters followed by six numbers) or the last four digits of your Social Security number and cast a provisional ballot. Once the information is reviewed and verified by the board of elections, your ballot will be counted.

If you do not provide one of the above documents or your driver's license/state identification number or the last four digits of your Social Security number at the precinct, you will still be able to vote using a provisional ballot. However, for that ballot to be counted, you must return to the board of elections no later than seven days following Election Day to provide a qualifying form of identification.
