HEAP SUMMER CRISIS PROGRAM

The Home Energy Assistance Summer Crisis Program provides a one-time benefit to eligible Ohioans with cooling assistance during the summer months. The program runs from July 1 to Sept. 30. The focus of the Summer Crisis Program is to help with electric utility bills, central air conditioning repairs, and air conditioning unit and/or fan purchases. Households with a household member who is either 60 years of age or older, has a certified medical condition, and households who have a disconnect notice, have been shut off, or are trying to establish new electric service may be eligible for assistance.

The Summer Crisis Program assists low-income households or those that have a disconnection notice, have been shut off, are trying to establish

Disaster Response

211 is a partner in disaster response in both Licking and Knox Counties. For example, during the recent heat dome, 211 fielded calls from the public looking for cooling centers.



Pathways also sent out text messages

to local social service agencies informing them of cooling center availability. If you live in Licking County, you can text PCOLicking to 898211 to sign up for text messages about community resources. If you live in Knox County, text PCOKnox to 898211 for community resource text messages. These are one-way texts so Pathways cannot reply to them. However, you can text your zip code to 898211 or call 211, to speak to one of our community resource specialists. For texts, messaging and data rates apply.


