Knox Area Transit has been renamed to Knox County transit and has launched a new

website as part of the transformation!

The new website *knoxcountytransit.com* is interactive and easy to navigate, and it lists KCT's *routes and fares*.

Flex routes will start in June. This means that riders will not have to call and schedule a ride; they can go directly to the stops and catch a bus. The flex routes are technically called deviated routes. That means the bus can deviate two blocks off the route between stops to pick up someone who has mobility issues getting to a bus stop.

Until the flex routes start on June 1st, riders must call KCT to schedule a ride. After the flex routes start, the agency will retain the on-demand rides as part of its service.
